

# IN YOUR CAR

## 1. FIRST-AID KIT

The kit should include a first aid guide; bandages; gauze; cold packs; antiseptic; cleanser; ointment packets; scissors; latex gloves.

## 2. FLASHLIGHT

A flashlight serves a dual purpose. It can be used as a light source. And, it can serve a handy weapon should you ever find yourself in a compromising situation. Make sure to get a heavy metal flashlight to keep in your car, in addition to spare batteries. Or, you can purchase a wind-up flashlight so that you won't have to worry about dead batteries.

## 3. JUMPER CABLES

## 5. AUTO ESCAPE TOOL

If your car is submerged in water, this tool is designed to break a window with a couple of blows. In addition, it has a sharp blade to cut through seatbelts.

## 6. CELL PHONE CHARGER

Purchase a cell phone charger that works in a car lighter.

## 7. MAPS

Purchase the most recent map. They are relatively inexpensive and can keep you from wasting gas if you are lost. Many cell phones come equipped with GPS features (Additional costs may apply).

## 8. WATERPROOF MATCHES

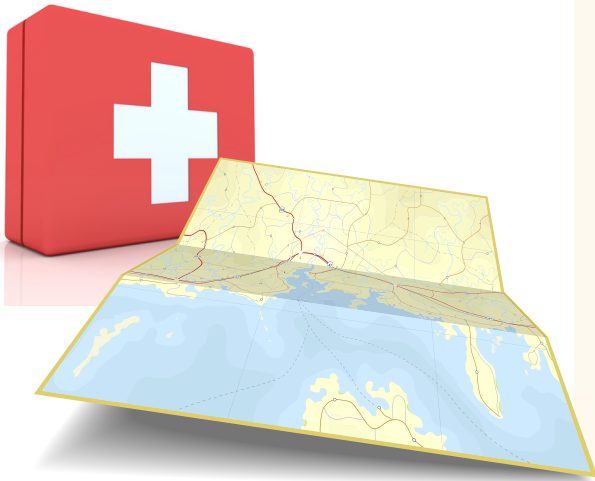
If you are forced to stay overnight in your car and have to make a campfire somewhere beside it, the last thing you want to worry about is how to start a fire.
